Intro/outro/bridge



The original version of this song is section A only, which is here expanded into an upbeat and hugely versatile funky round that makes a great basis for improvisation.

deep

- Start by learning section A and sing it as a two-part round, with the second entry after two bars (at the asterisk) or one bar (at the bracketed asterisk).
- Then teach section B and put it with the A section. Both parts can start together, or section B can begin after two bars (or one bar).
- Sections C and D can be taught on another occasion. Both fit with A and B, to make an eight-bar section in three or four parts. Remember to allow the upbeat in A and B before entering with C and D.
- When the group knows the whole song, imagine it as one long melody, and sing it as a four-part round with each new entry every eight bars, as on the recording.
- The four-part harmony section above makes an optional intro, outro, or bridge.
- · Almost any two bars chosen at random would make a good ostinato backing for any section or for the whole song. Get the group to experiment with different choices.
